CONTAINER SHIPPED TO THE PHILIPPINES

The annual container was loaded and shipped the second week in November. It is scheduled to arrive in Manila, Philippines the day before Christmas. The container carries

thirty thousand sets of VBS pupil leaflets for the children of the churches of the Philippines. There are also an estimated one thousand pillow case dresses for little girls and many sets of

From Sea to Shining Sea

As He walked along the shores of the Sea of Galilee, Jesus called Simon and Andrew to leave their nets saying, "Follow me, and I will make you fishers of

men." (See Matthew 4:19.) From this beginning, God has been with His churches until today. But there remains many people who have not heard the truth. ICP/His Offspring Ministries Philippines Director Jeremiah Abay has found



one such group on the extreme northern coast of the Island of Luzon and along the western coast of the province of Bataan where so many Amercians and Filipinos gave their lives at the beginning of World War II.

Jeremiah's family vacation turned into a mission ministry as he drove from Bataan in the south to Laong in the extreme north. (See Google map.) In the village by the South China Sea, near the the town of Marong, they ministered to a Baptist church we came upon last July, giving them Bibles and hymnals. The church building suffered damage as a typhoon swept through the area in September. Pastor Rod Anilao serves the church faithfully even though the tiny congregation is unable to pay a salary.

Jeremiah's heart for ministry compels him to try to help fulfill every need he finds. As they traveled north, Jeremiah stopped and visited churches and pas-

tors along the way. At Laong City (see map) he found a church and left Bibles and other materials.

Their vacation turned out to be a family missions trip as wife Eleine gave boxes of Bibles to one pastor's daughter along the way. The pastor will distribute the Bibles to church members and oth-

ers who have never seen or possessed a Bible. Meanwhile, sons Gabriel William and Joel Sandre helped their dad give hymnals and Bibles to Pastor Rod at the fishing village near Marong.

Farther north, the family noticed a farm of wind driven electric generators at an otherwise pristine beach on the far north at Pagudpud, Ilocos Norte (see map). Not far from there, as they played

along the beautiful, tropical beach, they spotted a man living alone in a small hut. Handing him a Tagalog language Bible, Jeremiah brought the gospel to this man on the shores of the Luzon Strait, between Luzon and Taiwan to the north.

In giving this simple man a copy of the Scriputres and witnessing to him of God's saving grace, Jeremiah helped in bringing the gospel from the shores of Galilee to the strait between the Philippine Sea on the east and the South China Sea to the west.

One can easily understand why Jeremiah, standing on the north shore of Luzon, thought about Jesus calling His disciples.

John and Sharon Sanders Encourage the Work of ICP Romania

Sharon Gay and I enjoyed a trip to Romania November 5-17, Sharon's first time back since leaving over twelve years ago. While there we accomplished a lot for the ministry of International Christian Publishers.

On Saturday, November 7, Sharon and I joined our ICP Romania General Director Liviu Clinciu in presenting a Teacher Training Workshop at the Otopeni Baptist Church near Bucharesti. We were pleased to have fifty teachers and pastors in attendance representing eleven Romanian Baptist Churches.



Liviu explained how to use all the materials which are available in the Romanian language. Sharon addressed the need for teachers to have a passionate heart for the lives and souls of their students. She also spoke about the earthly and heavenly rewards for faithful Christian workers. I spoke about the importance of reaching this generation of children and teens so that future generations can know to trust in God, rejoice in His mighty works and be obedient to His commands.



On Sunday morning I preached at the Otopeni church. We then traveled to Feldioara Baptist Church where the Lord led us to start our first mission work twenty-two years ago. We were thrilled to see former members from all three churches we organized in Romania. Sharon was overcome with emotion.



It was a special joy to spend two nights with Florin, Lidia and Terra Izdaila. Florin moved into our home from the Brasov orphanage in 1996 and later moved with us to the States. After he and Lidia married they lived with us three years in Loveland, Colorado, where Terra was born nine years ago.

During the week I had meetings with four American missionaries and a Romanian pastor. I also shared the ministry of ICP with a Romanian friend who is helping plant churches throughout Europe; countries where many of the four million Romanians migrated in 2007 after Romania was accepted into the EU.

We also spent two days assisting Liviu fill literature orders for a Romanian congregation in Spain and the missions of Missionary George Cormos. Brother Cormos is blessed to have a U. S. sponsor whose support to ICP is designated



to cover the cost of his literature order. More such sponsors are needed.

On Friday we traveled eight hours to be with Missionaries George and Mia Cormos in northwestern Romania, arriving in time to attend their Friday evening Bible Study in Tatarus where ICP materials are used with every age group.



On Saturday we conducted a second Teacher Training Workshop with teachers from both of Brother Cormos' works and two other nearby churches.



On Sunday, November 15, I was privileged to preach at Sacalasau Baptist Church in the morning and at Tatarus in the evening service. The people were very gracious to say they understood every word I spoke (Romanian language). I certainly enjoyed myself and pray that God was honored by the messages.

Our time in Romania was extremely beneficial to the work of International Christian Publishers. We were able to introduce our literature to a number of pastors and teachers who were not yet aware of the availability of biblical Sunday School and Vacation Bible School materials and to renew ICP's commitment to greatly expand the distribution of these materials.
